### PUBLIC COMMENTS

1. Beth Quaintance of the Salvation Army would like to use the Senior Center on March 25 for their Volunteer Appreciation event at low/no cost since the Salvation Army is a non-profit group. Her mother, Barbara Masten worked part-time for the City Recreation Department and will be the Salvation Army's Outreach Coordinator at the Senior Center. The Salvation Army assists the seniors in paying their energy bills due to their high medical and pharmacy bills they cannot afford to pay their bills. Robb asked for this event to be put on the March agenda for further discussion and action by the board.
2. Vicki Reeder, a volunteer with the EOC Adult Day Care Program in Templeton, requested use of the Senior Center the afternoon of March 11 for a Trivia Challenge Fundraiser to benefit the program. She requested the rental fees waived. The EOC program serves memory challenged adults, including those with Alzheimer's. Cindy Duff has already agreed to work the event. Robb approved to waive the rental fees due to the time of the event and the fees were also waived last year for the same event.

- Charlotte Gorton, Recreation Services Manager, reminded members of the March 1 workshop at 7 pm at the Council Chambers. This meeting is open to the public to discuss CDBG funding, which includes monies to renovate the indoor pool bathhouse at 28<sup>th</sup> & Oak Street.

- Lynda Holt, Senior Coordinator, discussed plans of the Veterans and the Senior Advisory Committee working together to put on the annual summer barbecue between the senior center and veterans facility. The date is May 6 from 12 to 2 pm and the committee members will be at the senior center earlier for set up.
- Clark and Dutra will work with Holt on a Committee for this event.

5. **Senior Activity Updates**

- Holt advised the Reagan trip was a sell out. Suzanne Ontiveros, Library Volunteer Coordinator, worked with Holt on this trip which was very successful and they really liked the Silver Bay bus. The next trip is April 2 to Shinzen Japanese Gardens in Fresno, CA.
- The movie, Shirley Valentine will be shown on Valentines Day at the Senior Center.
- Lynda has a receptionist volunteer training scheduled for Thursday 2/16/06.
- Holt is bringing back the Friday socials and the first one will be offering root beer floats. We also have Grandkids camp, ballet classes and many more classes offered at the senior center.
- The Big Band Dance was very successful with 110 in attendance. The Flower Lady donated all the flowers for the tables.
- Edna DeBardelaben, Event Coordinator for the Martin Luther King, Jr. event, advised 150 people were in attendance at the senior center, with many gifts donated. She thanked everyone for their support.

- Robb stated in the spring 2006 Recreation Guide the Transportation Workshops are advertised for March 2, 9 and 16, 2006 by Jody Dauth of Administrative Services for three sessions at various City locations.
