1. Downtown Parking and Circulation

A continued public hearing to receive public testimony and input from property owners, merchants and interested persons, and consider options related to downtown parking and circulation. Adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program are also proposed.

OPTIONS:

- a. Adopt Resolution No. 02-xx approving a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program; adopt Resolution No. 02-xx approving components of the Downtown Parking and Circulation Analysis and Action Plan; and direct staff to actively pursue the short-term measures described in the attached draft program (angled parking, signage, public information). This option would be to defer to the merchants and property owners to deal with employee parking in the downtown core area. Appoint a City Council ad hoc Committee to actively pursue longer-term options for increasing the supply of parking spaces in the downtown area and implementing the balance of the actions suggested in the attached draft program.

- b. Adopt Resolution No. 02-xx approving a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program; adopt Resolution No. 02-xx approving components of the Downtown Parking and Circulation Analysis and Action Plan; and direct staff to actively pursue the short-term measures described in the attached draft program (angled parking, signage, public information). This option would be to direct staff to prepare a budget proposal for consideration during the next budget cycle (FY 03-04), which would provide for time restricted parking in the downtown core area. Appoint a City Council ad hoc Committee to actively pursue longer-term options for increasing the supply of parking spaces in the downtown area and implementing the balance of the actions suggested in the attached draft program.
- c. Adopt Resolution No. 02-xx approving a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program; adopt Resolution No. 02-xx approving components of the Downtown Parking and Circulation Analysis and Action Plan; and direct staff to actively pursue the short-term measures described in the attached draft program (angled parking, signage, public information). This option would be to direct staff to prepare a budget proposal for consideration during the next budget cycle (FY 03-04), which would pursue increasing the supply of new parking spaces in the downtown core area. Appoint a City Council ad hoc Committee to actively pursue longer-term options for further increasing the supply of parking spaces in the downtown area and implementing the balance of the actions suggested in the attached draft program.
