**1. Earthquake Recovery & Downtown Vision Workshop**

Citizens, property and business owners, community organizations, design professionals, interested public, advisory bodies, Planning Commission, and City Council will all be encouraged to actively participate in a discussion regarding what has happened as a result of the December 22 earthquake and how the City can best move forward. The San Luis Obispo Council of Governments and Cal Poly SLO are participating and providing program support. The meeting will be facilitated by John Dunn.

The first workshop on February 19 will focus on seeking public input on a wide range of related topics; the second workshop on March 4 will explore options based on input received on February 19, 2004, and will begin the process of determining future plans for reconstruction, particularly as related to buildings that are slated for demolition and other structures that were impacted by the earthquake.
