MINUTES OF THE ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING
MAJOR PROJECT FUNDING WORKSHOP
PASO ROBLES CITY COUNCIL
November 20, 1997

The City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles, meeting in adjourned regular session at 7:00 p.m., in the City's Senior Citizen Center, Park Street, Paso Robles, California, was called to order by Mayor Duane Picanco with the following Council members answering roll call: Baron and Swanson. Council members Iversen and Macklin arrived shortly thereafter.

Public Comments: None Received

The Mayor announced that the adjourned regular meeting was for the purpose of discussing the financing of the City's list of major projects. Mayor Picanco identified the following major projects:

- Bridges
- Public Safety Facility
- Barney Schwartz Park
- Senior Center
- Airport Industrial

He further stated that the Council is looking for solutions to funding a total cost of capital projects that is estimated at \$40. Million

There followed a discussion that incorporated the perspectives of about 16 members of the audience. Focus included major projects financing programs of the Paso Robles School District, including the current voter approved tax override and potential financing that is being discussed for possible voter consideration on the June 1998 ballot.

At the conclusion of the discussion the consensus was to request City Manager Jim App to contact Julian Crocker of the Paso Robles School District (PRSD) and explore feasibility of hiring the same consultant as the PRSD is using for their public opinion Poll so that the City could conduct its own poll before the January 1998 deadline for making a decision regarding a June 1998 ballot measure.

There being no further business, at 8:45 p.m. it was moved, seconded, and passed unanimously to adjourn to the Regular City Council Meeting in the Library Conference Center on Tuesday, December 2, 1997, at 7:30 p.m.
