RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO CLOSE ALLEY.

BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council
of the City of El Paso de Robles, as follows:

THAT it is the intention of the City Council of said City
to order the following street work done in said City, to wit:

The closing of the alley running Northerly and Southerly
through Block 115 of said City from the Southerly Boundary of said
Block to the Northerly Boundary thereof; the City reserving, however,
an easement in and through said alley for the installation,
maintenance and repair of sewers, water pipes and gas pipes, and
telephone, telegraph and power lines.

That to do said work this Council does not deem it necessary
to take any land, nor is it necessary to establish a district to be
assessed to pay the damages, costs or expenses of said work, the
same being paid by persons interested.

That the Paso Robles Press is a weekly newspaper printed and published in said City and is hereby designated as the newspaper in which the Street Superintendent of said City will cause to be published in the manner and form required by law, a notice of the passage of this Resolution, and the said Street Superintendent is hereby directed to cause notice of the passage of this resolution to be posted in the manner and form required by law, and to cause a notice similar in substance to be published in said newspaper for a period of four successive insertions in the manner required by law.
