

RESOLUTION NO. 1468

RESOLUTION REQUESTING FURTHER STUDY OF FLOOD CONDITIONS
IN THE VICINITY OF PASO ROBLES

WHEREAS, a proposal to establish Zone 6 of the San Luis Obispo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District was presented to the City Council of this City, among others, by the Directors of said District; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Zone 6 initially embraces areas within this City as well as without, and the proposal was to study and recommend methods to finance and construct flood control facilities within said proposed Zone 6; and

WHEREAS, the vast majority of the residents in said area have signed a petition opposing the formation of Zone 6, and have likewise appeared before this Council again registering their opposition, principally on the grounds that engineering studies and construction of facilities would be far too costly for the property owners to pay for, and further, on the grounds that much of the area without the City of Paso Robles does not contribute water to flooding conditions, and further that the designed purpose of the Zone appeared to be to correct a condition affecting only a few property owners, whose property is located within a natural water course; and

WHEREAS, the Resolution of the Board of Directors of the San Luis Obispo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District No. 68-440, dated September 10, 1968, indicates that the proposed Zone 6 limits the area therein to "that watershed tributary to Twenty-third and Vine Streets in the City of Paso Robles, County of San Luis Obispo, State of California".

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of El Paso de Robles as follows:

1. That the Board of Directors of the San Luis Obispo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District do not establish Flood Control Zone No. 6 as presently delineated;


2. That this City, together with the Directors of the Flood Control District and its staff, pursue as a cooperative effort, a study of potential and actual flooding conditions of the entire watershed area, including this City; together with a study of estimated cost to construct necessary flood control facilities.
