

RESOLUTION NO. 99-35  
A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
EL PASO DE ROBLES TO ACCEPT THE BRONZE SCULPTURE FOR  
PLACEMENT IN THE DOWNTOWN CITY PARK

Whereas, at the January 12, 1999, regular meeting of the Recreation Advisory Committee, representatives of Paso Robles Main Street requested that the City accept a bronze statue of a dog to be placed near the drinking fountain in the City Park, "to promote public art as a way to bring distinction and recognition Paso Robles"; and

Whereas, the sculpture was cast by Metal Arts Sculpture Center in Paso Robles, for sculptor Christopher Bell (deceased) a nationally recognized artist; and

Whereas, Metal Arts Sculpture Gallery will provide materials and install the artwork, and will maintain the piece at no cost to the City five years; and

Whereas, the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee voted unanimously to recommend the City Council accept the bronze sculpture for placement in the downtown City Park.


