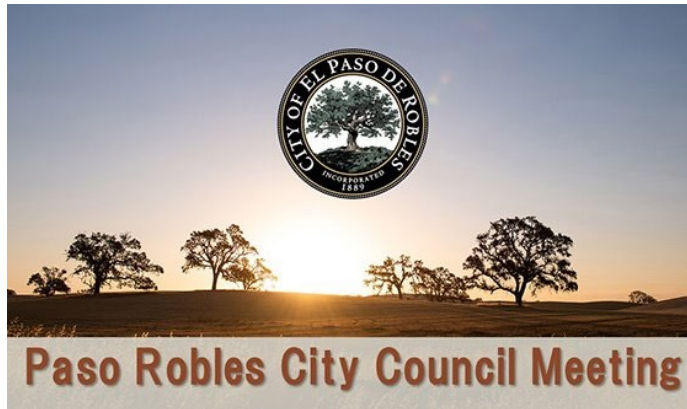

Approved an appeal to a Planning Commission decision for the [Thorndyke Business Park](#) on Wisteria Lane and Germaine Way. The approval allows future builders of park parcels to continue to get certain project approvals at the Design Review Committee level rather than having to go through a Planning Commission hearing. Saturday, April 15, 2023 at 10am-12pm. The group meets behind Wendy's on Niblick Road.

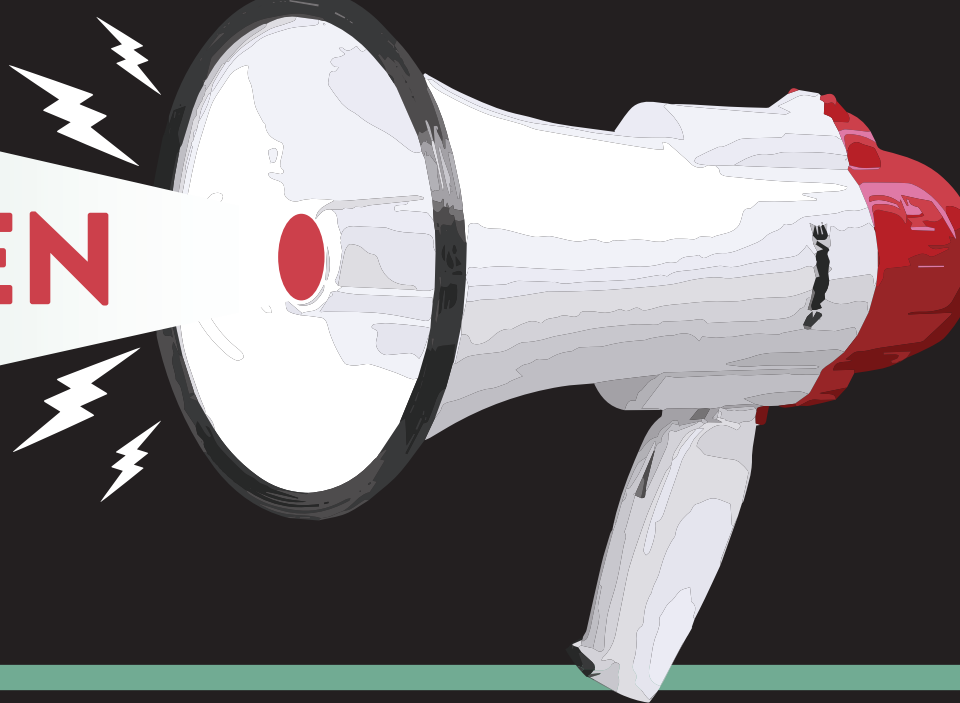
