DISCUSSION ITEMS

- 1. Approve Minutes of the October 10, 2018 Meeting**
Motion made by Kathy Barnett, seconded by Nick Gilman, passed 4-0.
- 2. Street Maintenance Status Report**

Ditas Esperanza, Capital Projects Engineer, presented the Street Maintenance Status Report to the Committee. Stephen – how will work on Spring Street be scheduled for summer and the fair? Ditas – we'll negotiate or postpone not to work during the two weeks of the fair, and we'll complete the portion by the schools first. Nick - who financed the fiber optic conduit portion for 13th Street? Ditas- it was a combination of SB1/Supplemental Sales Tax/SLOCOG Grant/CDBG, they all have a component. Kathy – what are the boundaries of the funds used for certain items (i.e. Pedestrian signal). Dick – multiple grants were used for paying certain items. Supplemental Sales Tax funds are used for road repairs. The City is careful of how Supplemental Sales Tax funds are used. Kathy – regarding the Dry Creek project, what happens if the County says they won't be doing their portion, that they won't have the funds? Ditas – we have a draft cooperative agreement in place, and all seems to be going okay. Dick – and if that happens, then the City's portion of the project stops at city limits. Nick – regarding Union Rd along BSP, what was the scope? Ditas – City added two lanes, a center lane, and parking. Stephen – is the forced sewer main going into Union? Ditas – future force main, still need lift/gravity station, building pipe now. Kathy – were the sewer lines under the street budget? I have a hard time understanding all the additional items. Ditas – it's part of the overall project but from the sewer fund. In the staff report, I break out each item and what fund they will be paid from. Kathy – where do we stand on Creston Road? Dick – City applied for a Grant but did not receive it, so we'll either crank the scope of the project back or do some work and resubmit for the grant. We're adding sewer lines this summer at Tanner & Ferro but no resurfacing. If there's no grant involved, we'll do what we can with what we have. Nick – regarding the roundabout, presumably that's what the city's going to put into place at Union and Golden Hill? Ditas – yes, that's correct. Dick – it will be a figure eight roundabout. Nick – the traffic is bad now what about during construction? Dick – we have ideas we're discussing to route traffic. Kathy – what are we doing to prepare residents about a renewal of the sales tax, what's happening? Dick – when you come back in a year or so, we will ask for a ½ cent or 1 cent but right now, it's too early to discuss this happening.

The Committee received and filed the status report. Motion made by Kathy Barnett, seconded by Nick Gilman, passed 4-0.

3. Supplemental Sales Tax Revenue and Expenditure Report

Dick McKinley, Public Works Director, presented the Supplemental Sales Tax Revenue and Expenditure Report to the Committee. Dick – we are working on the next 6-year plan. Stephen – is January not a complete month? Dick – no it's not, it's just what's been received so far. Kathy – anymore comment on the mockup maps? Dick – yes, we use them all the time. Nick – those maps were very helpful the City should use those to show what's been done versus what needs to be done.

The Committee received and filed the revenue and expenditure report. Motioned made by Nick Gilman, seconded by Kathy Barnett, motion passed 4-0.

COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS:

Press releases – will do again, maybe include the maps.

UNSCHEDULED MATTERS:

Kathy – I'm concerned about the ADA curbs; some are different from area to area. Dick – they're built to ADA Standards and it's a constantly changing process, but we do build them per ADA Standards. Councilman Gregory – the islands being constructed, are they just on Park Street? Is that a mid-island post stop? Dick – it can be.

Spring Street – 24th to 36th

The pipeline work has been completed. Repair of road surface, minor landscaping, and ornamental lights are in progress. It is 80% complete with most of the work done. Waiting for PG&E to install ornamental lights scheduled for November.

Annual Slurry Seal (FY 2019-2020)

The project was awarded to American Asphalt South and work has been completed. There is a remaining budget of \$62,400. This will be used to place slurry seal at the following locations:

Dry Creek Road Surface Repairs

Water and sewer lines within Dry Creek Road are completed. The repair will be completed in two phases. Phase one, which is underway from Airport Road to the Estrella Warbirds Museum. First order of work is for the contractor to remove the upper layer of deteriorated asphalt. Once removed, the contractor will grade the roadbed to create the designed road with a defined crown section. Underground conduits (6,200 LF), will be placed and old dilapidated drainage culverts will be removed and replaced. Flushed with pavement concrete curbs (12-inches wide), will be placed on both sides of the road to create a defined road edge. The existing road (13-inches deep), will then be reworked and mixed in a lime cement material, which will chemically react to the soil and provide a structured section for the road. A final surface of Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA), will then be placed on top, and lastly, pavement striping.

Union Road along Barney Schwartz Park

The Project was awarded to Calportland Construction and is steadily progressing. It is 90% completed. The remaining item left is installing a pedestrian activated signal for safe crossing at the main entrance to the park.

Union Road and Golden Hill Road Intersection Improvements

On December 18, 2018, City Council awarded the contract to prepare preliminary engineering for this intersection. The preliminary design was presented to City Council for review and acceptance. Utility coordination is underway, as well as contacting adjacent properties to work out access during construction. City Council directed staff to proceed with the final design.

Downtown Pavement Rehab

City Council has awarded the contract to rehabilitate and repair the following streets which are on the Adopted Streets Maintenance List:

- 10th Street – Spring Street to Vine
- 9th Street – Spring Street to Pine
- 8th Street – Spring Street to Pine
- 7th Street – Spring Street to Pine
- 6th Street – Spring Street to Pine
- Park Street – 6th to 9th Street

Conduits and several curb ramps are needed before work begins on the actual road repairs.

Jardine Road Repairs

On January 21, 2020, City Council directed staff to enter into an agreement for San Luis Obispo County to get the road repaired, and the City would reimburse them for the work. Treatment consists of leveling course on the east side (mostly the bad areas), and then a full width 2-inch overlay. San Luis Obispo County awarded the contract to Calportland Construction. Work is scheduled to begin in late October/early November.

Westside Roads Rambouillet and adjacent streets rehab

Correct Timing Is Key

City streets crew's maintenance repairs ahead of CIP projects can decrease the cost of CIP projects

- Fewer subcontractors & associated markup
- Maintenance slows the deterioration of pavement

Capital Improvement projects timed correctly prevent more costly repairs





Pavement Deterioration



Two main causes:

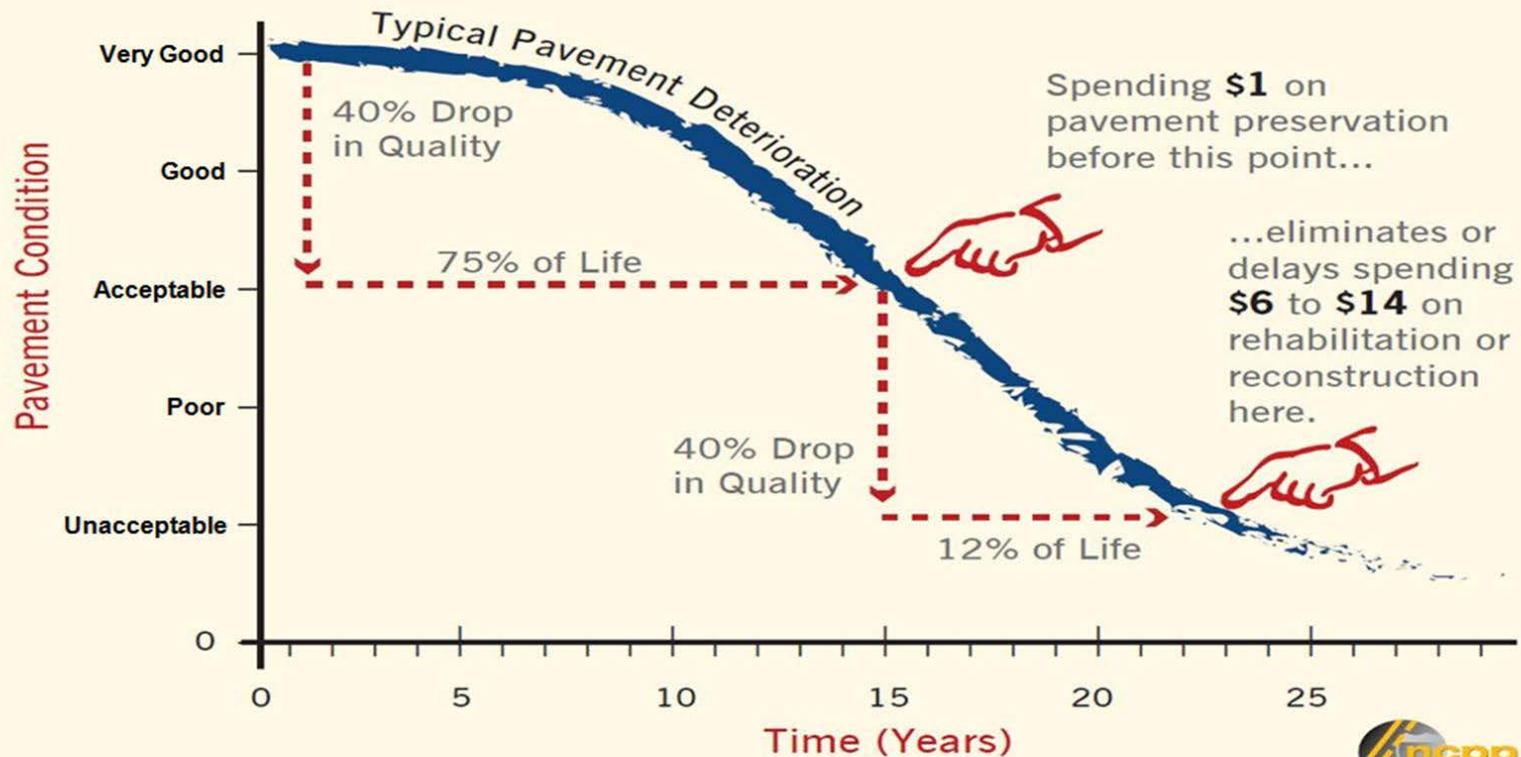
- Environmental (sun, rain, temperature fluctuations)
- Loading (heavy loads and repeated, lighter loads over time)

Minor asphalt patching (potholes)

Minor sidewalk repairs

Crack filling & sealing

Sign replacements

Traffic and street light repairs

Small-scale striping refreshing (crosswalks)



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City Streets Maintenance Crew

During 2019 the 4-person crew:

- Patched potholes using 237 tons of hot mix asphalt - that's about 475,000 pounds!





City Streets Maintenance Crew

- Ground down 145 linear feet of raised sidewalk edges





City Streets Maintenance Crew

- Crack sealed 1,001,500 square feet of road surface



- 15 lane-miles of streets
- 23 acres

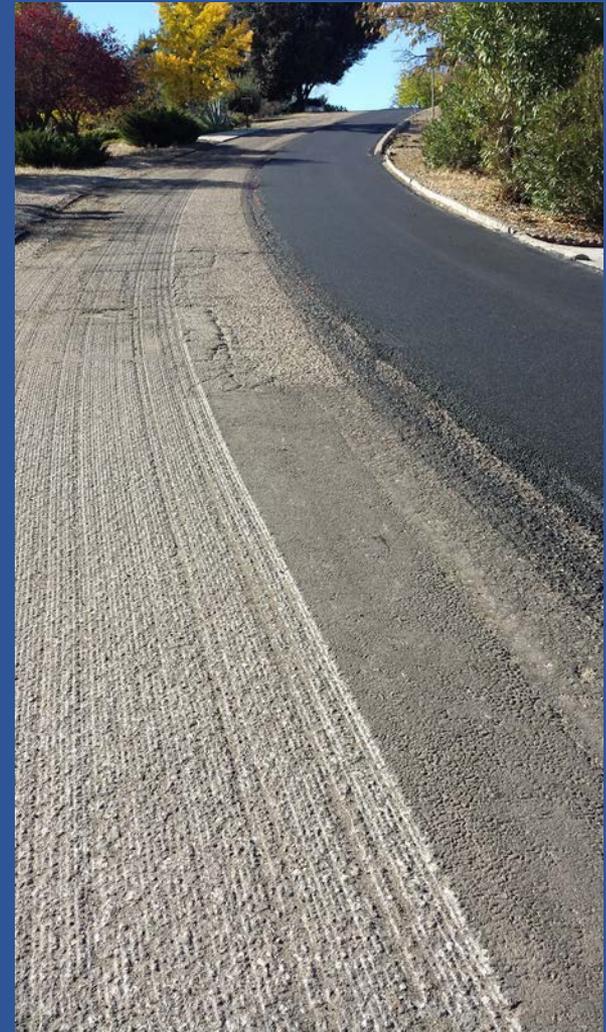

Creston Road – Myrtlewood To Niblick Road

- Maintenance surface treatment
- Not hot mix asphalt
- Cost: \$0.50/SF
- Increases street's PCI 7 points
- Protects from sun & rain for 5-7 years

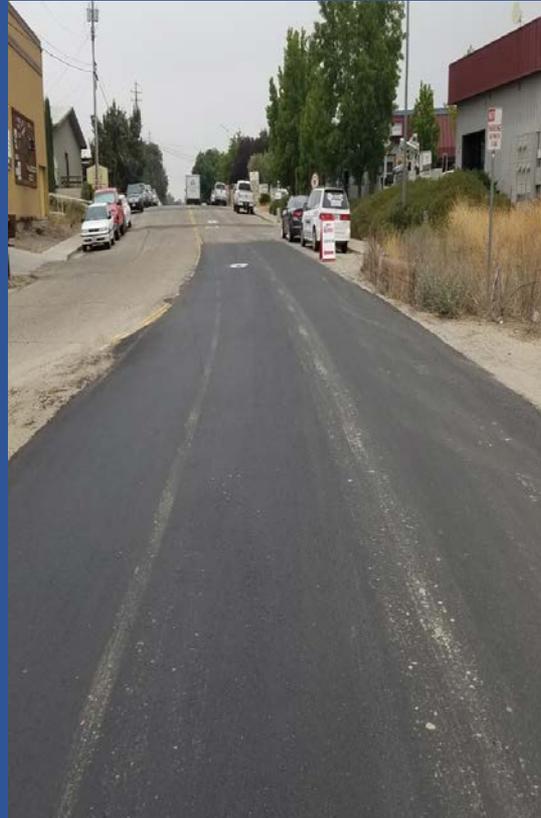

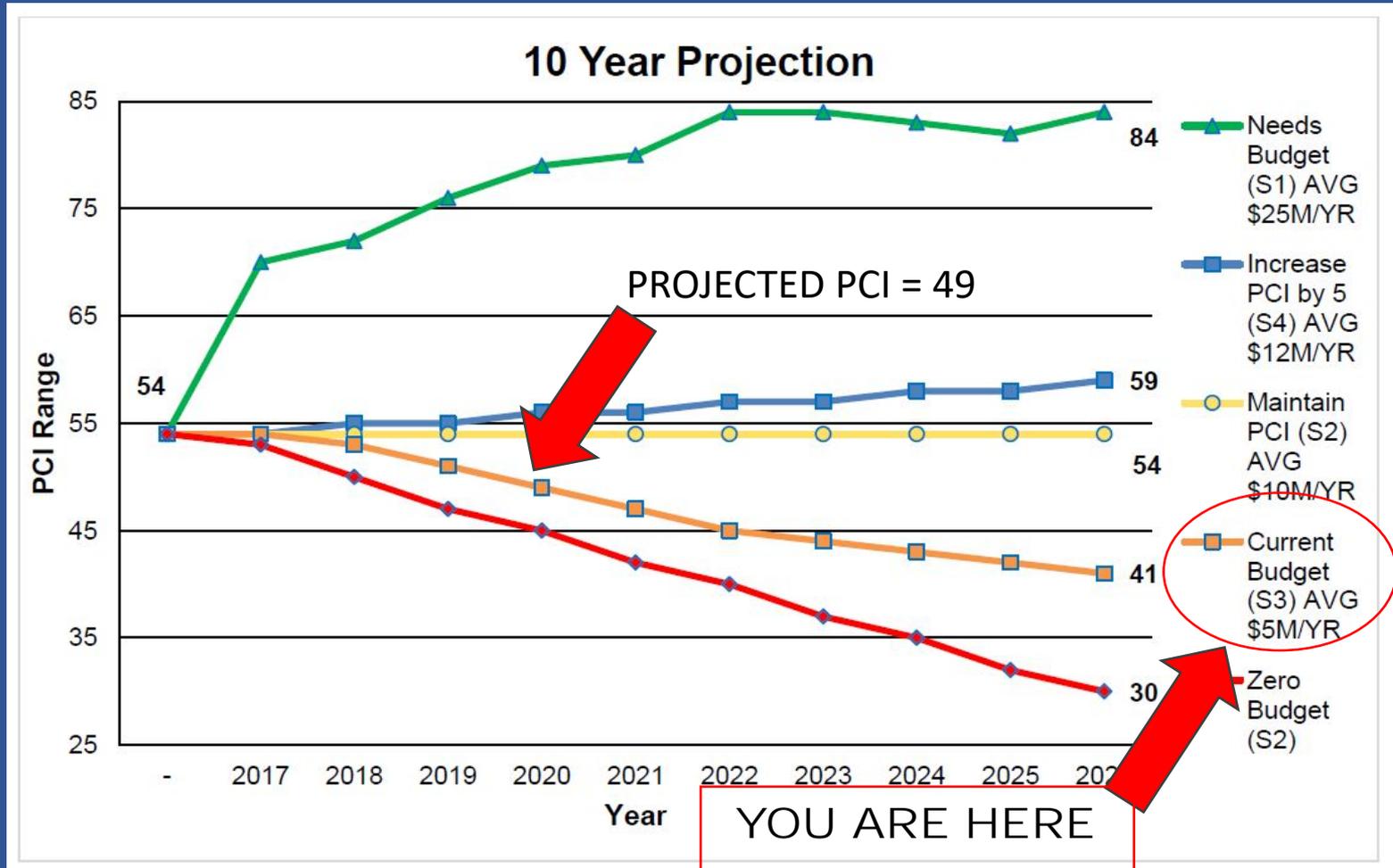

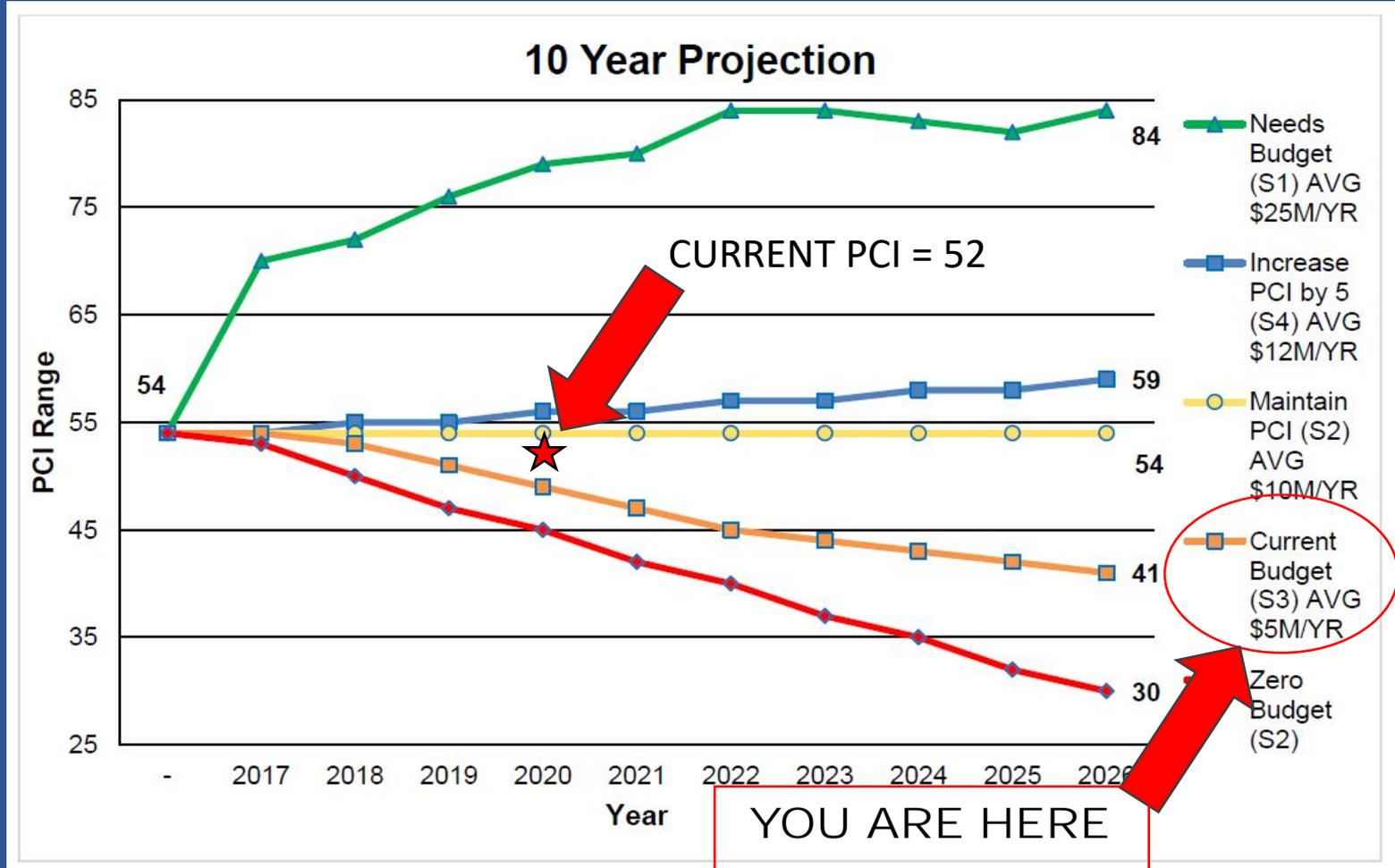


2016 Pavement Study Results





CIP & Maintenance Have Held PCI At 52 Instead Of Dropping To Projected 49





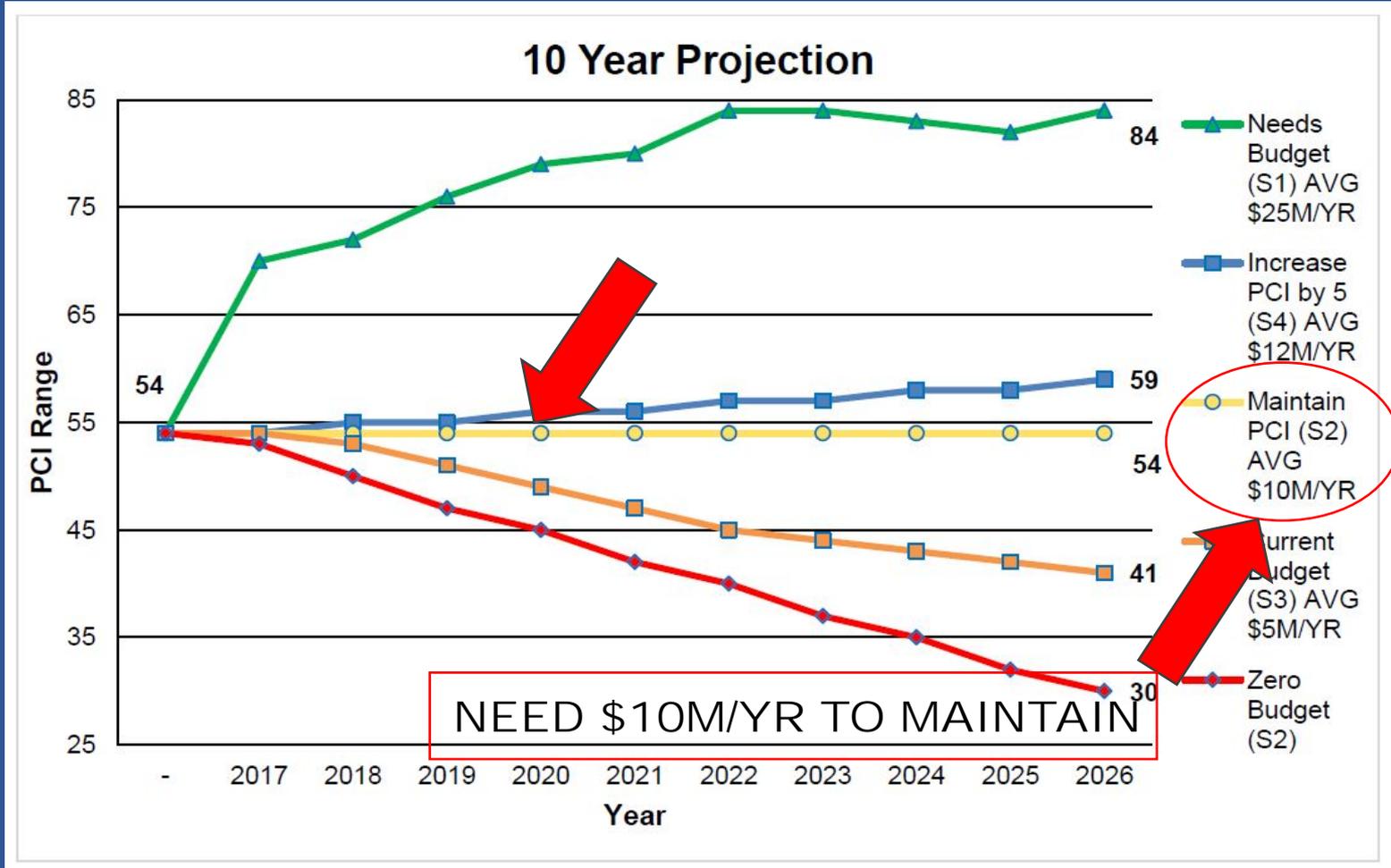


- City street maintenance + CIP street work is making a difference

- Pavement constantly deteriorates



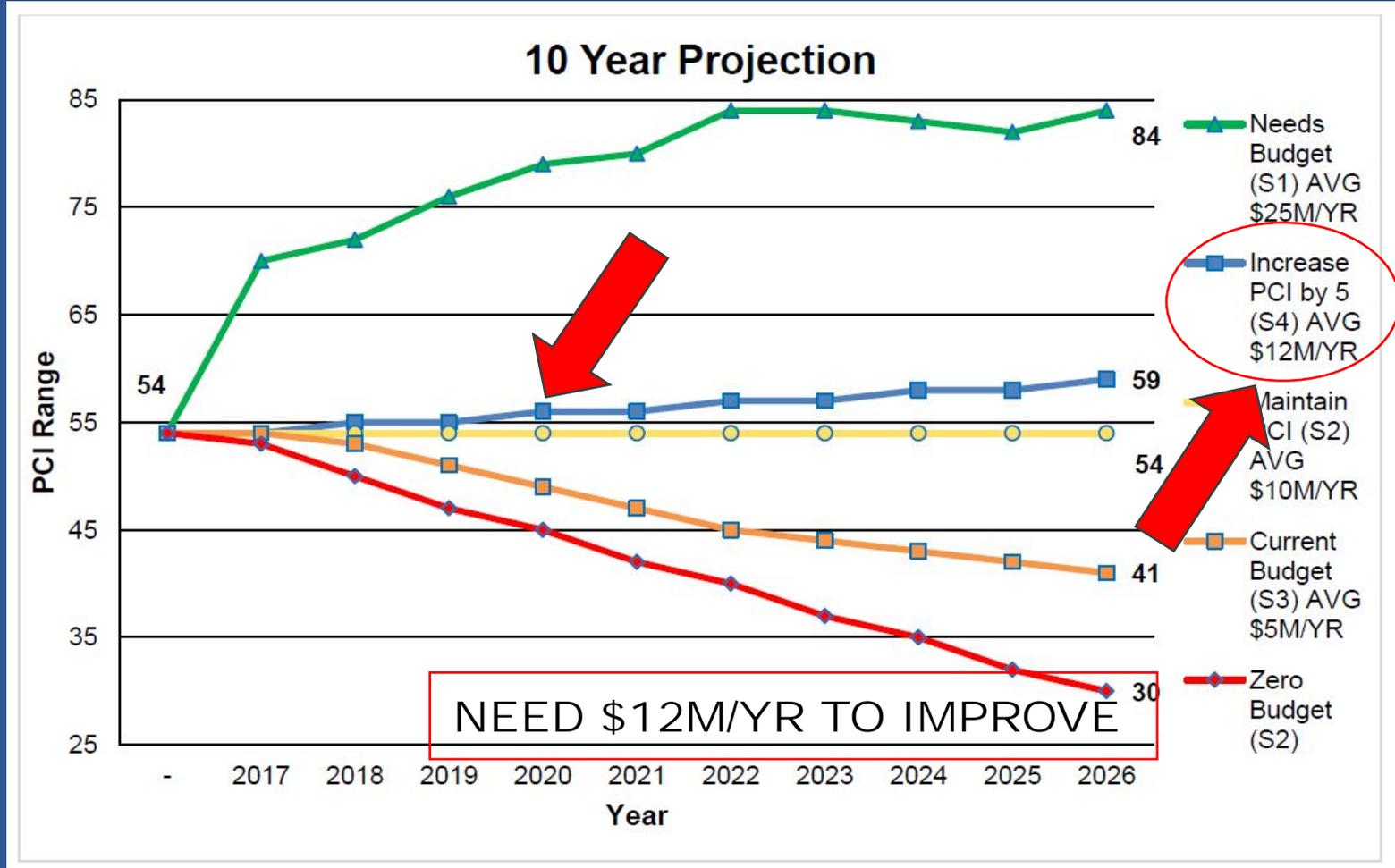


Budget Of \$10M Would Prevent PCI From Falling

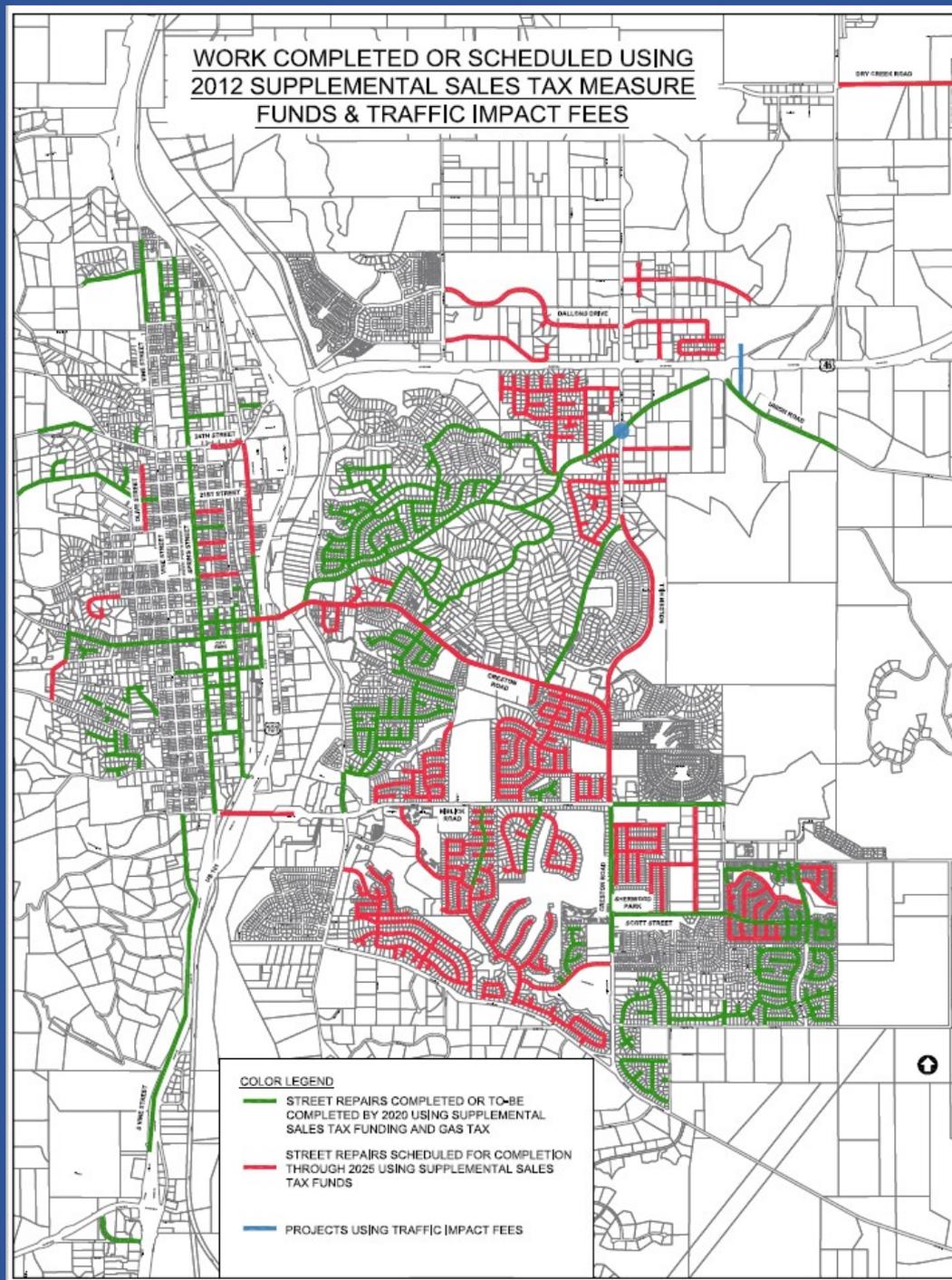

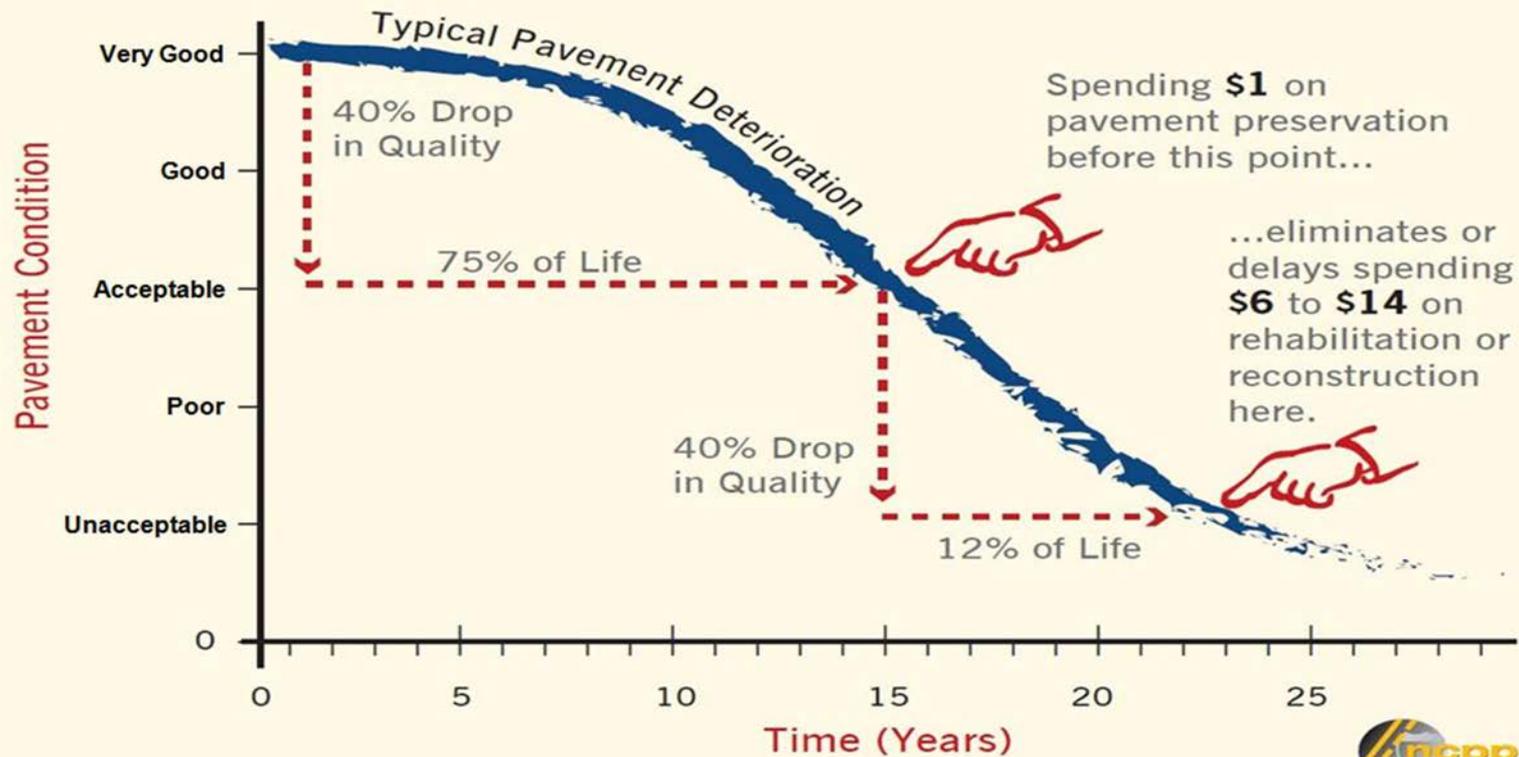
- We use a pavement management system

How Are Streets Chosen For Maintenance Or Repair?

Additional considerations:

- Use the water & wastewater master plans to avoid streets that need underground upgrades
- Group neighborhoods of similar projects to avoid extra mobilization costs
- Avoid streets where development or school projects are scheduled (i.e. 17th Street by Bauer-Speck)
- Budget



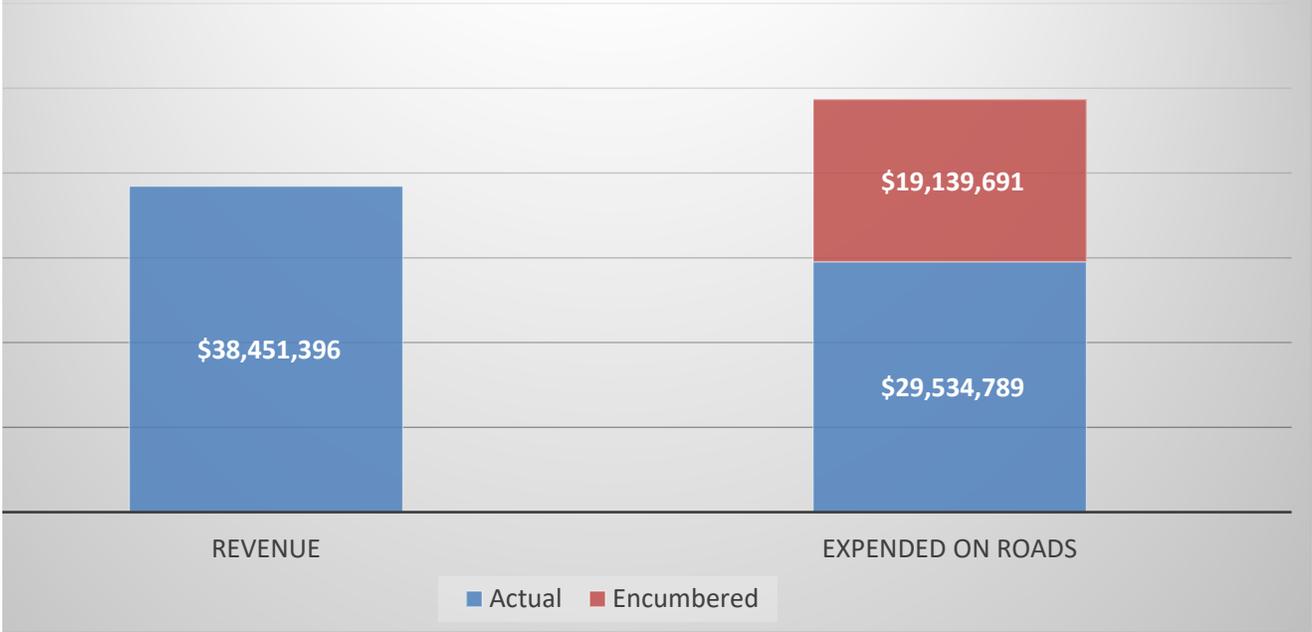
Crack Sealing Makes Streets Look Bad – Why Do You Do It?



- Adds 2 years of service life
- Cost \$0.15/SF
- Better pricing for slurry seal projects
- Increases street's PCI 4 points
- City streets crew can do the work
