14. **Cannabis Update**

PUBLIC COMMENT. Sunni Vogel Mullinax, Dale Gustin, Grace Hall, and Gina Fitzpatrick

ROLL CALL VOTE: Motioned by Councilmember Strong, seconded by Councilmember Garcia, and passed 4-1 (Hamon opposed) to receive and file the presentation from staff and HdL Companies; reaffirm the City Council's desire to advance the development of the cannabis governance framework, including recreational retail cannabis sales, approve the policy development and public outreach plan; and to direct staff to incorporate the public comments received as a part of the deliberation of the process.

15. **Rescinding Resolution 16-141 Approving of an Agreement with the 16th District Agricultural Association for the Sale of a Portion of Pioneer Park Property**

ROLL CALL VOTE #1: Motioned by Councilmember Strong to postpone a decision on this item until the first meeting in October. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Garcia. After much discussion and several attempts to modify the motion Councilmember Strong asked to modify the motion to defer this item for six week and bring it to Council at the second meeting in August. The seconder of the motion did not agree to the modification and the motion died for lack of a second.

ROLL CALL VOTE #2: Motioned by Councilmember Gregory, seconded by Councilmember Garcia and passed 3-2 (Hamon and Strong opposed) to delay the rescission of this agreement until November 1, 2022 to allow the board and manager of the fair to work with DGS to bring back language for the agreement that will work for DGS, the Fair, and the City.


17. **Current Council Committee Activities and Reports**
