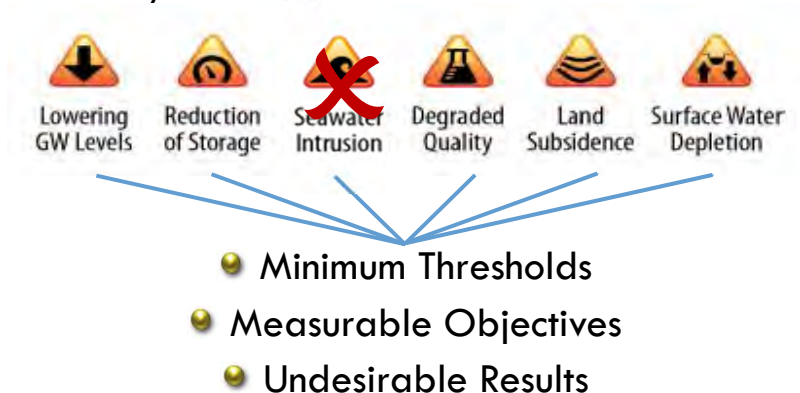

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Sustainability is Outcome Based

- Sustainability is defined for each of five sustainability indicators

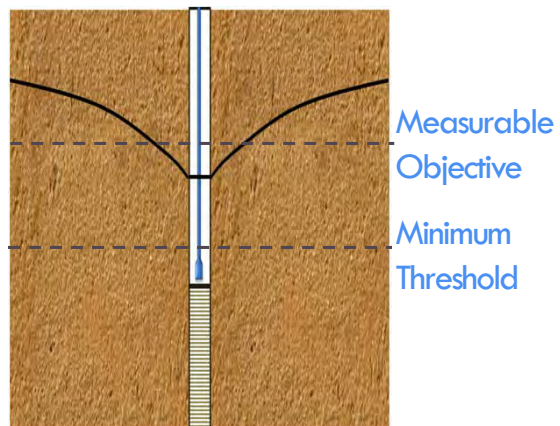


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Defining Sustainability

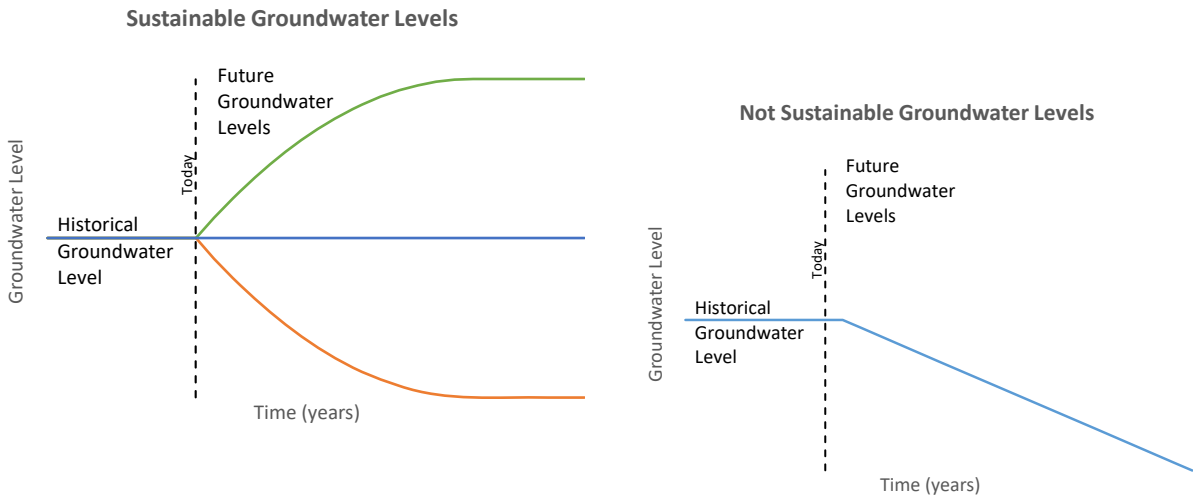
- Minimum Thresholds are your “line in the sand” that you don’t want to cross
- Measurable Objectives are safety factors above the Minimum Threshold that you want to shoot for
- Undesirable results are the collection of minimum thresholds you must not exceed.

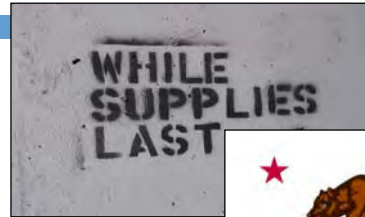

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Groundwater Rights Generally

- Groundwater rights are not a possessory ownership right
- A right to extract groundwater is more like an option – exercisable only while supplies last
- Water rights holders have the right to “take and use water,” but they do not own the water and cannot waste it (*Central and West Basin Replenishment Dist. v. Southern Cal. Water Co.* (2003) 109 Cal.App.4th 891, 906)

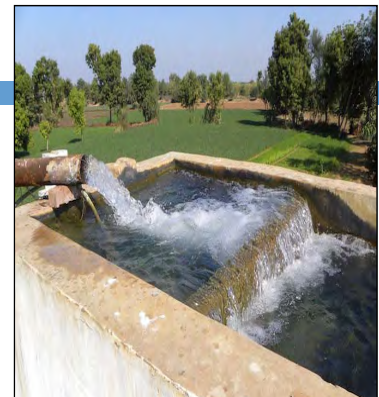


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Groundwater Rights Generally, cont.

- Landowners are overlying right holders
- Overlying rights are not quantified, but are correlative
- In a shortage, each overliar is apportioned their “proportionate fair share of the total available groundwater based upon reasonable needs
- You do not lose your overlying right for non-use



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SGMA and De Minimis Users

- Under SGMA, a “de minimis” user is anyone who extracts 2 acre-feet per year (or less) for domestic purposes
- De minimis users are subject to SGMA, depending on local needs
 - GSAs will decide how de minimis users are incorporated
 - GSAs can decide to exclude or include
 - GSAs can decide on fees
 - GSAs cannot require metering

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What are Projects and Management Actions?



Management Actions (largely non-structural, focused on conservation)

- Management decisions and tools
- Mandates vs Incentives
- Agreements



Projects (infrastructure - intended to increase supply)

- Infrastructure construction
- New supplies
- Exchange/movement of supplies



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Potential Attributes/Screening Criteria

- Yield/Basin benefit in AFY
 - Reliability year to year
 - Quality Concerns
- Ability to benefit measureable objective(s)
- Implementation timeline
- Costs – capital and O&M (\$/AFY)
- Institutional/technical issues
 - Legal authority
 - Regulatory/permitting
 - Water rights
 - Contractual
- Environmental impacts
- Regional/third-party economic impacts

The Paso Robles Groundwater Subbasin is a critically overdrafted high priority basin. Therefore, areas within the Basin must be managed under a GSP by January 31, 2020.

The GSAs listed below joined together to form a Cooperative Committee with the purpose of leading development of one GSP for the portion of the Paso Robles Basin in San Luis Obispo County.
